Brothers and Sisters of Local 638,

At the December union meeting, I reported that I would be writing a formal letter to General President McManus asking permission to proceed with nominations and hold a 638 election of Officers which would be held in June 2023. I am anticipating that he will approve my request, probably before the January meeting. This means we would proceed with May nominations and an election would be held on June 3rd. After the conclusion of the election process and after the new Officers are sworn in, the Trusteeship will be lifted. Brother Cliff Ryder will assist me with planning the election. We are not far off from bringing this difficult time in Local 638's history to a conclusion.

The nine former 638 Officers have all pled guilty to crimes and are in the process of being sentenced. In early December, the U.S. Attorneys' Office reached out to me asking for a Victim Impact Statement that would be presented to the judge prior to sentencing. I want to be perfectly clear that the request was made only to me. No other Local 638 Officer was contacted by the Government nor was any 638 Officer involved in my decision not to provide a statement. I declined to provide a statement in connection with the sentencing of the former Local 638 officers based on the following considerations:

- 1. Since my arrival here at Local 638 back in October 2020, I have had many conversations with 638 members about the indictments. Almost all agreed that, if the facts underlying the government's charges were true, then the former 638 officers should be punished for their actions. I agreed, recognizing the real harm inflicted on Local 638. In early December, the first of the guilty pleas was entered. In my conversations with 638 members about sentencing, it was clear that there were many who had strong opinions: some wanted the judge to impose a severe sentence, some wanted less severe sentencing, and some wanted leniency. These divergent points of view were reflected in the many letters Local 638 members sent to the sentencing judge.
- 2. I felt that choosing sides on this matter would create more instability and division in Local 638. My job as Trustee is to try and lessen the instability and division, not add to them. I stated at the December Union Meeting that I would not be providing a Victim Impact Statement regarding the nine Officers and I remain steadfast to that commitment.
- **3.** U.S. law enforcement, including the U.S. Attorney's Office for the Southern District, has conducted the investigation, brought charges, and obtained guilty

pleas from the nine former officers of Local 638. I have confidence in our American system of justice and trust that they will receive the sentences they deserve.

4. I have not had conversations with Local 638 members regarding the guilty plea and upcoming sentencing of James Cahill. I do feel that it is appropriate to make a Victim Impact Statement that speaks to his involvement in this case, and I intend to provide a letter to the sentencing judge at the appropriate time.

Like all of you, I am looking forward to bringing the Trusteeship to a conclusion and moving on from this chapter in all our lives. Every decision I've made since I arrived here has been in your best interest. I know all of you may not agree with that, but I assure you I have had nothing but good intentions since I arrived here as your Trustee back in October 2020. I understand the anger and frustration many of you have in light of what happened; you have every right to express your opinion on the matter. Soon Local 638 will be back to self-governance, I know you are looking forward to that. I am as well.

Brothers and Sisters,

I hope you and your families had a healthy and happy holiday season. I am pleased to share that after a long and difficult time for Local 638, the Trusteeship is coming to an end and a general election is likely in June of this year. We have much to look forward to in 2023.

Over the past several months, the indicted officers have pled guilty to crimes that shook the foundation of our union. In the months prior to the plea agreements, the possibility of charges was discussed among the current officers, on the floor of union meetings and by the membership. While the justice system is determining their sentences, there is strong consensus that the appropriate time has come for Local 638 to take its own actions to hold the former officers accountable. Accordingly, on behalf of the current salaried officers of Local 638, I have filed charges against the former officers. Upon the termination of the Trusteeship, these charges can be read and voted upon by the membership, and if accepted, heard before our Executive Board. Taking this step is necessary for Local 638 to put this troubling time behind us.

This has been a difficult period for all of us. I want to thank every man and woman in this Local who continued to show up and work with dignity every day despite these events. It is the good work of the men and women of this Local, both on the job and in our communities, that has always been the cornerstone of our union. You are directly responsible for helping to rebuild our reputation and stabilize Local 638

Like many of you, I was devastated when the indictments were handed down in October of 2020. When asked to step

up and lead Local 638 during the most difficult period in our union's history, I took on the task of helping to rebuild the organization and address long-standing complex issues. Like each of you, I continued to show up each day and do my job to the best of my ability with honesty and integrity. I am proud of my contributions over the past two years as Business Manager. It has been an honor to serve this membership.

There is a small minority who claim that our best days are behind us. I reject this bleak view of our future, and I will not allow anyone to diminish what Local 638 has accomplished during these difficult times. These individuals often speak without understanding or caring about the complexities of the current challenges we face. Often those divisive voices are the loudest but lack truth and integrity. Let's not allow this to be the voice that defines us. We must remember that the most important thing is that we preserve and support this union's ability to provide for our families. I would ask the silent majority to do as it always has – make the choice to move this union forward.

As the Trusteeship comes to a close, we are presented with the opportunity to make a fresh start. I look forward to working with you to shape the future of our union. I wish you and your families good health and happiness in the new year. Let's continue the good work of Local 638.

As we begin the new year, and close the book on 2022, I would like to share my thoughts on what we can look forward to in the year ahead. This cannot happen as we look to move forward. We need to reset and push the restart button to rebuild and strengthen our union so we can leave it to the next generation of Steamfitters.

This year the Enterprise Association of Steamfitters turns 139 years old. I take heart in knowing that over that long period of time there have certainly been ups and downs, but this union persists for the same reason it

started: Hardworking men and women dedicated to taking care of each other on the job and in their communities, collectively focused on growing and securing opportunities for us ALL to be able to work safely, earn respect on the job, and most of all retire with DIGNITY! I hope we can take encouragement in that as I look forward to working for this membership in the coming new year.

Enterprise Association of Steamfitters Local 638

Eligibility to Vote: As provided in Section 124 (a) of the U.A. Constitution, no member is eligible to vote in any election of officers unless he or she has been a member in good standing in Local 63 8 for a period of one (1) year immediately prior to the date of the election. Any member who owes or has paid a reinstatement fee within a period of one (1) year immediately prior to the election shall not be eligible to vote in the election. In addition, as provided by Section 160 (a) of the U.A, Constitution any member who has entered into business legitimately for himself or herself, or who holds a financial interest in any business directly connected with the plumbing and pipe fitting industry, shall not have the right to vote in any election unless six (6) months have passed since the member has terminated his or her business or financial interest in such business. As provided in Section 148 (b) of the U.A. Constitution, apprentice members who satisfy the foregoing requirements shall be eligible to vote if they have successfully completed their third apprenticeship year as of the date of the election.

Members should be prepared to present their membership cards, ID cards, driver's license, or other forms of identification at the polls.

Eligibility to Run for Local Union Office: As provided in Section 121 of the U.A. Constitution, no member shall be eligible to accept a nomination and run for office in Local 638 unless he or she shall be a journeyman member and shall have been a member of the United Association and Local 638 in good standing for at least a period of two (2) years immediately prior to the date of the election. Any journeyman member who owes or has paid a reinstatement fee within a period of two (2) years immediately prior to the date of the election shall not be eligible to be nominated for office. As provided in Section 160 (c) of the U.A. Constitution, no member who holds a financial interest in any business directly connected with the plumbing and pipefitting industry may run for or hold union office until six months after the member has terminated such financial interests.


